Emergency Order #9 Pursuant to Executive Order 2020-04

The applications were reviewed by a five-person committee as follows:

Applications were scored according to the following criteria:

| Criteria | Weight (maximum score of 100 points) |

| Amount of Funds Requested | 5 points |
| Use of Funds | 25 points |
| Explanation of why funds are necessary for maintenance of essential component of State's healthcare system during the COVID-19 state of emergency | 40 points |
| Impact of denial of request | 25 points |
| Grant or loan requested | 5 points |

The following zero-interest loans have been recommended by the Committee and approved by the Governor. The Committee is continuing to review applications and it is expected that additional allocations will be recommended and approved. Many applicants were awarded an amount that is less than what the applicant requested.
